## A New Approach to Top Up Funding

We have been working with Slough head teachers, SENDCOs, local authority officers and a range of specialists to review our current banding model in Slough which can be difficult for parents and professionals to understand.

The new approach is designed to take the 2014 SEND Code of Practice into account; offer a single banding model for all schools that is fair and easy to understand; clearly reflect the needs of each individual child and ensure that the funding for children and young people with SEND is used most appropriately.

Slough Borough Council plans to introduce the new arrangements from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019, for new requests for EHC assessments and for children with an EHCP who are transferring to the next education phase in 2020. There will be **no changes** to the funding for children and young people in existing placements.

The consultation period has recently been extended and will now end on **Friday 1**<sup>st</sup> **March 2019**.

## SEND Strategy Refresh

The LA and its partners are currently undertaking a refresh of the local area **SEND Strategy: 2017-2020**. The aim is that the new strategy should:

- Be co-produced with children and young people with SEND and their parents and carers
- Represent high aspirations for children and young people with SEND, underpinned by a strong collective vision and compelling narrative

• Establish a "golden thread" between the local area's vision, self-evaluation and priorities for improvement. Following on from some workshops with stakeholders and young people at Arbour Vale an initial draft has been developed for wider consultation.

Ofsted seeks your views on changes to the education inspection framework from September 2019

In January this year, Ofsted released their proposed new **Education Inspection Framework** 2019: draft for consultation (EIF) which sets out how they propose to inspect schools, further education and skills provisions and registered early years settings using four key judgement areas:

- 1. quality of education
- 2. behaviour and attitudes
- 3. personal development
- 4. leadership and management
