Why?

It is a momentous time for the NHS and public health. We've been able to create a series of highly effective and safe vaccines which will help us end the coronavirus pandemic. Evidence so far suggests the vaccines reduce the risk of death, serious illness, hospitalisations, and the spread of coronavirus.

Becoming a 'Vaccine ambassador school' will help:

1. Contribute to your whole school approach to health and wellbeing
2. Contribute towards covering the following topic from the statutory health education curriculum: 'The facts and science relating to immunisation and vaccination.'

What are we asking of schools?

We would like your school to become a 'Vaccine ambassador school'. The aim of this will be two fold:

- 1) To support school staff with knowledge and understanding of the vaccines and empower them to become vaccinated and to become champions of the vaccine.
- 2) To reach your pupils families to support them with getting vaccinated and protecting themselves from coronavirus. In turn, helping to reduce the circulation of the virus in your school.

What is being offered for schools?

- 1) A 'Vaccine ambassador school' logo and pledge certificate for you to display in school reception and to advertise on social media and newsletters
- 2) Bespoke posters to display in areas frequented by staff, parents, and visitors to the school
- 3) Access to translated vaccine information resources
- 4) Access to a school staff and a school parents/families virtual information session delivered by a local GP and public health expert.
- 5) Tailored hard copy versions of the local vaccine FAQ guide for you to use at school with staff, parents and visitors
