If you work with anyone in council housing who mentions such problems, please check they have let the team know. They can email [damp&mould@slough.gov.uk](mailto:damp&mould@slough.gov.uk), with their full name, address, phone number, email address, the room(s) where the damp or mould is located, the description of the problem and if anyone in the household suffers COPD or other respiratory conditions.

If they've been in touch about this over the past two months, they don't need to make contact again, unless things have worsened.

#### Energy Support

This is an energy efficiency scheme that requires specific targeting for eligible households. These are households that have to meet three criteria:

- low income below £31k per annum combined household income
- poor energy efficiency EPC (D or lower) EPC certificates explained - Which?
- off-gas heated by electric or oil, preferably not landlord rented, but owner-occupied.

## Household Support Fund

The Household Support Fund (HSF) grant of £2,355,383 is funded by the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP). It is available until 31 March 2024. We, the council, cannot commit to applications made once all the available funding has been allocated.

The grant helps families and vulnerable individuals who struggle to pay for basic living costs, such as:

- food
- energy
- water bills
- essential goods.

We provide a locally managed government grant to a wide range of low income households in our community:

- who are most in need of support, and

- to help with significant rising living costs and
- to those who may be going through exceptional hardship.

The HSF will be awarded at our discretion following an assessment of eligibility. Each case will be treated strictly on its individual merits. All those deemed eligible will be treated equally and fairly within the constraints with the HSF budget.

We will make sure any award given is used for the purpose it was applied for. Most of the award will be given in goods or services by online vouchers only.

# SIGNPOSTING

## Have you claimed?

The total amount of unclaimed income-related benefits and social tariffs is now £18.7 billion a year. We estimate that £7.5 billion of Universal Credit is unclaimed by 1.2 million eligible households. Take up is lower for locally administered benefits. Council Tax Support is the most underclaimed, with 2.7 million people missing out on £2.8 billion of support. Social tariffs are also significantly underclaimed. Broadband social tariffs have the lowest take up, with 97% of eligible households missing out on the tariffs. People on means tested benefits should check for eligibility with their utility providers.

## Entitled to - Benefit Checker

Individuals can carry out their own free benefit check to see what they are entitled to. It is easy to use and take about 10 minutes to complete.
