National Guidance

Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCSIE)

The Department for Education (DfE) is consulting on proposed changes to its statutory guidance on keeping children safe in education. These will also reflect the changes being made to the Working Together to safeguard children statutory guidance (below). The consultation also seeks views on a new non-statutory advice document on responding to sexual violence and sexual harassment between children in schools and colleges. Deadline for your comments is 22 February 2018.

Working Together 2018 Consultation

Working Together to Safeguard Children consultation ended 31 December 2017. The statutory guidance which sets out what is expected of organisations, individually and jointly, to safeguard and promote the welfare of children is expected to be ready for March 2018.

These revisions are being made largely to reflect the legislative changes introduced through the Children and Social Work Act 2017 and new 'child death review' guidance. I will keep you posted of the revised guidance so you can update your safeguarding policies accordingly.

Operation Encompass

Operation Encompass is a unique Police and education early intervention safeguarding partnership which supports children and young people exposed to domestic abuse. It reports to schools before the start of the next school day when a child or young person has been involved or exposed to a domestic abuse incident the previous evening. The information is given in strict confidence to a school's DSL to enable support to be given dependent on the needs and wishes of the child. **Also look out for the MARAC training on the training guide.

Sexual violence and sexual harassment between children in schools and colleges guidance

The Department for Education (DfE) has published non-statutory advice for schools and colleges on how to prevent and respond to reports of sexual violence and harassment between children. This covers: what is meant by "sexual violence and harassment between children"; schools' and colleges' legal responsibilities; the importance of having a whole school or college approach; how to respond to reports of sexual violence and sexual harassment; safeguarding and supporting all children involved.

Relationships and sex education guidance consultation

The Department for Education is considering how to update the existing Sex and Relationship guidance which, was last updated in 2000, and is therefore now out of date. The updated guidance will support schools in delivering the new subjects of Relationships Education at primary and Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) at secondary, as well as, potentially, Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE).

The new relationships and sex education guidance, which will come into force in 2019, will cover mental health, staying safe online and issues affecting lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender pupils to make it relevant to modern life. Peer on peer abuse toolkit

Farrer & Co, in collaboration with Dr. Carlene Firmin, has published a toolkit to help schools prevent, identify early and respond appropriately to peer-on-peer abuse. It provides guidance on developing and introducing a peer-on-peer abuse policy and a template peer-on-peer abuse policy. Topics covered include: developing an overarching policy and introducing it to the school community; tailoring your policy to your school's specific context; risk assessment; appropriate language and approaches; ongoing protective work.
