#### Major review into support for children with SEND

Five years on from the reforms introduced to better support children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), the review aims to improve the services available to families who need support, equip staff in schools and colleges to respond effectively to their needs as well as ending the 'postcode lottery' they often face.

The review comes a week after the government announced a major funding boost of £700million in 2020/21 for pupils with the most complex needs, delivering on the Prime Minister's pledge to ensure every pupil can access the education that is right for them. It will conclude with action to boost outcomes and improve value for money, so that vulnerable children have the same opportunities to succeed, as well as improving capacity and support for families across England. #### Slough SEND Team Restructure

September 2019 sees a restructure of the SEND service designed to increase the capacity to deliver the SEND strategy and focus on an early intervention approach to identifying the needs of children and young people with SEND. **Two cluster groups** of SEND Officers have been created with one focusing on Early Years to Primary education and the other focusing on Secondary to

Post 16 education. The clusters will be lead by our new Senior SEND Officers, **Hannah Henderson** (EYFS & Primary) and **Pooja Sharma** (Secondary & Post 16) reporting to the SEND Team Manager, **Emma Kinrade.** SEND Officer and Educational Psychologist caseloads will be communicated to schools as soon as possible at the start of the Autumn Term. **Email:** sendteam@slough.gov.uk, **Tel:** 01753 787676

#### **Slough Local Area SEND Inspection Expected**

We are currently nearing the end of Local Area SEND Inspections which started in 2016 and will end in 2021.

Joint inspections are led by OFSTED and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) as part of their national programme of joint inspections of local areas designed to independently evaluate how well a local area carries out its statutory duties in relation to children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities in order to support their development.

Inspections review how well the local area is; identifying SEND, monitoring and assessing the needs of SEND, improving outcomes for children and young people with SEND by examining the local authority, clinical commissioning groups (CCGs), public health, NHS England for specialist services, early year's settings, schools and further education providers. Inspectors visit education providers, such as nurseries, schools, colleges and specialist services to gather evidence and an understanding of how all local providers and agencies work collaboratively together to improve the life chances of children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities.



Evidence 4 Impact (E4I) is an independent service that provides teachers and school leaders with accessible information on which educational interventions have been shown to be effective. Many educational interventions claim to be evidence-based or supported by research, but it can be difficult to assess these claims or compare the evidence for different interventions.

Evidence 4 Impact (E4I) aims to overcome this difficulty by providing a simple evidence rating system and concise evidence summaries that enable you to make a well-informed judgement on the extent to which a programme's effectiveness is proven, including details on their effectiveness and cost, together with links to the providers and experts who can offer further support. The database can be easily searched by key stage, subject area and targeted group, so that results are tailored to the specific needs of your class or school.
