Welcome back from the Easter break. I hope you all indulged in some chocolate eggs and are fully rested. So, what's new in the safeguarding world this term? Well, where do I start!

Firstly, a huge thank you to all schools for completing the online Sec 175 safeguarding audits. We have had a 100% return rate which is excellent news. I will be circulating the final report from the audit analysis once it has been endorsed at the LSCB Education sub group later this month. Just to let you know the portal is open again and you can go in and update your action plans if you would like to keep the document, a 'live working document'.

Secondly, congratulations to Slough Children's Services Trust (SCST) following tier 3 week 'Inspection of Local Authority Children Services' (ILCAS) Inspection in which it has made significant progress in tackling the deep-rooted problems that resulted in children's services being rated inadequate. SCST received the improved rating of 'requires improvement to be good', and the leadership teams at both the Trust and council have robust plans in place to ensure progress continues.

Nationally, there has been a big focus on **knife crime** and Ofsted have published guidance **Knife Crime (Ofsted, 2019)**. Locally, we have been working with the Office of Police Crime Commissioner and the Safer Slough Partnership Slough to bring support and awareness of youth, violence, vulnerability and exploitation across schools with pupils and teachers via Alter-Ego's county lines plays, multi agency training and specialist support for individuals at risk including some direct support for schools.

More details are outlined below under local updates, with training, lesson plans (KS3&4) and local performances for young people around knife and gang activity.

We will continue to work as a partnership to tackle current threats and harms in an innovative way.

There are some fantastic training opportunities from modern day slavery through to criminal exploitation of children. There is also new to the role of DSL, and safeguarding modules coming soon. I am really excited about our new 'Learning from Experience' workshop with the latest cutting edge from domestic abuse serious case reviews (SCR).

Slough is continuing to progress the Early Help Preventative model around mental health provision over the coming months and I will share updates as I receive them.

The **Slough LSCB** will be going through changes to adapt to the new Safeguarding Partners structure and model over the coming months. Other changes includes Ofsted's new framework. Watch this space for further updates.

Finally, if any school/setting would like additional **Egress accounts** please let me know by 10 May 2019 as I will be ordering a batch of 25 additional licences if we have enough users. As you are aware Egress will only operate the school's egress account on a yearly cycle. Please review your usage and how many licences you require as I will be doing a refresh next term ready for the refreshed contract in the autumn term.



Tools and resources

The child exploitation (CE) screening tool is now 'live' for anyone who works with children. If you are worried that a child may be being exploited, this tool gives you a list of indicators to help you work it out and take appropriate action. Often, children do not recognise themselves as victims, or that they are being groomed, and as a result disclosures of such abuse can be unlikely. Therefore, this indicator tool aids the identification of exploitation. If you are concerned a child is being exploited, complete the tool and make a referral to children's social care. LSCB CE Tool

The Slough **neglect screening tool** seminars will discuss non-compliance and consent issues as a key component of risk factors in neglect which we have learned from serious case reviews. The 2 hour seminar will help practitioners with understanding the application of practice standards around neglect and the application of the neglect tool. Peer on Peer abuse -Brooks Traffic Light tool

The Sexual Behaviours Traffic Light Tool supports professionals working with children and young people by helping them to identify and respond appropriately to sexual behaviours (age appropriate) through a traffic light system to categorise the sexual behaviours of young people and is designed to help professionals:

- Make decisions about safeguarding children and young people
- Assess and respond appropriately to sexual behaviour in children and young people
- Understand healthy sexual development and distinguish it from harmful behaviour

Local updates and projects

In the last newsletter I highlighted the Early Help panel and its remit. It is currently available for professionals who are struggling with complex cases with providing multiagency decision making and support for children and families with complex needs and cases that lead professionals within the community/school are unable to progress.

- Co-chaired by the Operational Manager EH Hub (SBC) and **Consultant Social Work** Manager(SCST)
- Multi-agency panel meets weekly
- All submitted cases are reviewed by members 48 hours prior to panel
- Each referrer attends panel to present their case to partners.

Local intelligence (Intel)

So what do we mean by intelligence?

We welcome the support of the education sector to ensure our children are kept as safe as possible in school settings and have a greater chance of reaching successful outcomes.

The 1.5 hour free workshops are to help us understand what type of intelligence to gather/capture and how to report it. Why it's vital to keeping people safe from gangs, youth violence, sexual exploitation, modern slavery

Safequarding children and young people in education from knife crime (Ofsted, March 2019)

The Knife Crime (Ofsted, 2019) research sought to find out:

- What are schools...doing to safeguard young people from knife crime while on school premises?
- How are schools...giving children the knowledge and skills to stay safer in their local communities?
- How are exclusions being used when children bring knives to school?

One of the challenges outlined on the Ofsted research report was the problem of finding highquality resources to help talk about knife crime with pupils. The Home Office and the PSHE Association have a set of materials for use with Key Stage 3 and 4.

Youth Offending Team; Weapons Awareness and Serious Youth Violence sessions

The Youth Offending Team offer workshops to schools to address Weapons Awareness and Serious Youth Violence'. County Lines, knife crime and CSE workshops for secondary schools

The Office of Police Crime Commissioner and the Safer Slough Partnership will offer a range of initiatives across phases from awareness to targeted detached work in schools. The first wave concentrates on:

Tier 1a: A performance aimed at secondary school students to raise general awareness of: County Lines, grooming, Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) and **Child Criminal Exploitation** (CCE). This is delivered as a single 50 minute theatre performance which includes a short post-show talk clarifying subjects covered in the play.

Young people are provided with an information leaflet at the end of the performance with more details including signposting to sources of help and advice. The schools will also be provided with access to online resources that were created for the project by the Children's Society.

Tier 1b: Workshops educating young people on gangs, knife crime and County Lines to reduce the risk of them becoming involved in criminality.

The sessions aim to educate and empower 11-16 year olds to help them make the right decisions about crime and violence. They will address issues which have been chosen in consultation with young people and demand from local police and schools like; how easy it is medically to kill someone if you have a knife, how tough sentencing can be, what it's really like in prison and the ripple effects a murder has on the victims and perpetrators, parents and siblings. It will also include testimony from victims and families.

The workshops are interactive, listening yet challenging young people's preconceptions about crime - particularly when it comes to debunking myths or glamorizing particular lifestyles. Sessions provide a safe platform to discuss issues in a non-judgmental way in order to educate and change young people's behaviour and perceptions.

Support for PHSE: Choices programme ready for roll out

The 'Choices Programme' that was being designed by Lime. Many of you have already been involved in the development, working with Lime to create resources that will assist young people in Slough to build their own resilience across all the issues.

They then look at what influences choices and how they make decisions and what the potential implications could be. National updates and resources

New Ofsted framework to be published shortly: 'The real substance of education'

Ofsted's focus is on moving towards a curriculum led framework. It is aiming to move away from separate judgments and looking at performance data and moving towards looking at the quality of education and ensuring the needs of the less able children are inclusive. Inspectors will continue to judge whether safeguarding is effective or ineffective.



The curriculum is at the heart of the proposed new framework: Ofsted's working definition...

- 'The curriculum is a **framework** for setting out **the aims** of a programme of education, including the knowledge and skills to be gained at each stage (**intent**)
- for translating that framework over time into a structure and narrative, within an institutional context (implementation), and
- for evaluating what knowledge and skills pupils have gained against expectations (impact/achievement).'

Mental Health and Behaviour in schools Nov 2018

It gives advice on:

- how to create a whole school culture, including promoting positive mental health
- understanding the link between mental health and behaviour
- how to identify children with possible mental health problems

Elective home education (EHE): Children not in school

The EHE consultation ended on 2 April 2019. A further survey has been launched which concludes on 24 June 2019 structured around establishing and setting up a formal register of children who are educated at home:

- a duty on local authorities to maintain a register;
- a duty on parents to supply information for the register;
- a duty on certain settings to supply information; and
- a duty on local authorities to provide support for home education

Online Harms White Paper

The Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS) and the Home Office have launched a consultation on the Online Harms White Paper which proposes a new series of online safety measures in the UK. The NSPCC has been campaigning for an independent regulator and a mandatory 'duty of care' to require companies to take reasonable steps to tackle harmful activity or content on their sites and the White Paper includes these proposals.
