Government clarifies which children can get Covid vaccine in updated Green Book

The <u>government has updated its Green Book guidance</u> with more detailed information about which children aged 12-15 are eligible for a Covid vaccine. We are still seeking clarification from NHS England about exactly which autistic children and young people will qualify under the 'severe neurodisability' umbrella. ## In the news



The British public will be able to help in the fight against malicious cyber criminals thanks to a new <u>scam</u> <u>website reporting service</u>.

The National Cyber Security Centre's new website reporting tool allows people to send them a link from websites which they think are trying to scam the public, regardless of how they got to the site.

The NCSC – which is a part of GCHQ – then analyses the site, and if found to be malicious a notice may be issued to the hosting provider for the site to be removed, preventing members of the public falling victim in future.

Public can now report scam websites direct to the NCSC - NCSC.GOV.UK
