## WHAT IS THE ANGEL?

The Knife Angel is a stunning 27ft tall, 3.5 ton sculpture of an angel made out of 100,000 confiscated knives received from 43 Police Forces across the UK. Originating from The British Ironwork Centre in Oswestry and created by sculptor Alfie Bradley it took over two years to construct.

The Angel has been on tour around the UK and has become a national monument against violence and aggression in all its forms.
