1.	<b>Welcome, introductions and minutes of last meeting 21.09.2022</b> No actions outstanding	Jatinder Matharu
2.	<p><b>SCF Update (virtual presentation)</b></p> <p><b>Early Help:</b> Donna presented the proposed changes in the Early Help, linking to the step up and down processes from social care. A draft EH strategy will be circulated for your input shortly.</p> <p><b>Social Care:</b> Fanny updated the group on the various teams. Fanny reported SCF are nearly at full capacity within the workforce. The Referral and Assessment Team (dealing with Level 3&amp;4) has now been replaced by Assessment Intervention Team which hosts 5 teams comprising 2 Team mangers and 5 assistant team managers. This team will undertake brief interventions from the point of referral for 6 months. Within this team is a domestic abuse service called The Shine Project. They will work with both men and women which is currently being evaluated with Respect for accreditation.</p> <p>Any cases post 6 months will go to Safeguarding and family support team (also has 5 teams) to manage long term CIN, CP and PLO cases. A further 2 teams called Innovate are employed for additional capacity.</p> <p>There is also the Children with Disabilities Team, Children Leaving Care and Children Looked After Teams. An Exploitation and Youth Justice Team managing serious youth violence risks, statutory orders and criminal exploitation.</p> <p><b>Action: An updated structure chart of these teams is attached to the minutes.</b></p> <p>Fanny shared the work around Serious Youth Violence in Slough called Op Deter . This project will follow up any ‘stop and search’ (by TVP) young people carrying weapons. A worker will make contact within 90 minutes of a YP in custody and provide intensive interventions for up to 7 days.</p> <p>As part of the Knife Angel and the Month of Action, Slough have commissioned Faron Alex Paul, anti knife campaigner. Steel Warriors and Booth Bus which will be in Slough on the 12th and 26th January 2023 to share their experiences from London. Schools can identify children they would like to engage with this programme. <p>3.</p>	<p><b>School Updates:</b>          HH shared there is no contact when a sec 17. Schools are not informed what is taking place.          Fanny advised CIN meetings should meet within 10 days to develop the CIN plan and review within 3 months.  <u><b>Action: Fanny to build in TAF/professionals meeting in the criteria to keep partners informed of CIN</b></u>          AJ asked about children with disabilities CIN plans that last longer than 3 months, Fanny explained those CIN plans are different as their needs are different and often longer-term needs, reviewing package of support.</p> <p>SD asked about long waiting lists for early help as many families are in limbo. Advise to re refer if anything changes in the wait time. MASH writes support plans and contingency plans before transferring families to Early Help Team.</p> <p>Concerns raised about parents withdrawing consent in between the waiting time for Early help support.</p> <p>The outcome of Referral and assessment is often not shared. Fanny reassured the group that she is now trying to improve the practice and to ensure that professionals are informed of the outcome.  <u><b>Action: Any withdrawal of consent cases which have not been communicated correctly to be shared with Fanny directly.</b></u></p> <p>For any level 4's it is best practice for social workers to inform parents if it does not place the child at further risk.</p>	<p>All</p>
<p>4.</p>	<p><b>Pupil Voice:</b>          Two different ready-made surveys were discussed for schools to use to capture the voice of the child on health wellbeing and safety.</p> <p><b>1. Oxwell Survey</b>          There are 350 questions covering lifestyle choices, safety, health and wellbeing in this anonymous survey targeted at years 5 and 6. It takes about 30 minutes to complete. The aim is for pupils to complete in school. The window for the survey takes place between 21<sup>st</sup> Feb and 21<sup>st</sup> March 2023.          There is a parental opt out form if they wish their child not to participate. It is a ready-made questionnaire about          Once your school registers then you can download a load of resources including parental letters, assembly packs, how to run peer surgeries including a new website.          The data will be presented in June 2023 (after it has been cleansed) which will provide themes across your school. This will include follow up support and a detailed analysis of your data. Lancaster Model</b></p> <p>The public health promotion model called the ‘Lancaster Model’ is being rolled for reception and Year 6 pupils. This will replace the ‘old version’ of the health questionnaire.</p> <p>The questionnaire will be completed for reception children by parents by registering via a link on a letter which will be shared on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> Jan. Any risks identified will be discussed with the parents.</p> <p>Year 6 is different as it requires the pupils to complete the questionnaire themselves in school during lesson times, facilitated by a school nurse and a teacher. This way any issues raised can be answered directly aby the school nurse. The questionnaire will take about 20 minutes to complete. School nurses to discuss logistics directly with the school. This process will start after half term February.</p> <p>A letter of consent has been developed for parental consent for schools to send to parents. Parents have 4 weeks to provide consent. Heather will track weekly and chase up any low uptake through schools.</p> <p>Schools will receive a report by Easter by the school nurses to discuss themes in the findings for your school.
