Social Care: For information from Primary DSL Network:

Fanny updated the Primary DSL Network on 11th Jan 2023 which has been shared with this group as she was unable to attend the Secondary Network.

Fanny updated the group on the various teams. Fanny reported SCF are nearly at full capacity within the workforce.

The Referral and Assessment Team (dealing with Level 3&4) has now been replaced by Assessment Intervention Team which hosts 5 teams comprising 2 Team mangers and 5 assistant team managers. This team will undertake brief interventions from the point of referral for 6 months. Within this team is a domestic abuse service called The Shine Project. They will work with both men and women which is currently being evaluated with Respect for accreditation.

Any cases post 6 months will go to Safeguarding and family support team (also has 5 teams) to manage long term CIN, CP and PLO cases. A further 2 teams called Innovate are employed for additional capacity.

There is also the Children with Disabilities Team, Children Leaving Care and Children Looked After Teams. An Exploitation and Youth Justice Team managing serious youth violence risks, statutory orders and criminal exploitation.

Action: An updated structure chart of these teams is attached to the minutes.

Fanny shared the work around Serious Youth Violence in Slough called Op Deter. This project will follow up any 'stop and search' (by TVP) young people carrying weapons. A worker will make contact within 90 minutes of a YP in custody and provide intensive interventions for up to 7 days.

As part of the Knife Angel and the Month of Action, Slough have commissioned Faron Alex Paul, anti knife campaigner. Steel Warriors and Booth Bus which will be in Slough on the 12th and 26th January 2023 to share their experiences from London. Schools can identify children they would like to engage with this programme. Haybrook and 4 other secondary schools are engaged in the programme.

4. Pupil Voice:

Two different ready-made surveys were discussed for schools to use to capture the voice of the child on health wellbeing and safety.

1. Oxwell Survey

There ae 350 questions covering lifestyle choices, safety, health and wellbeing in this anonymous survey targeted from Year 7 to Year 13. It takes about 30 minutes to complete. The aim is for pupils to complete in school. The window for the survey takes place between 21st Feb and 21st March

There is a parental opt out form if they wish there child not to participate. It is a ready-made questionnaire about

Once your school registers then you can download a load of resources including parental letters, assembly packs, how to run peer surgeries including a new website.

The data will be presented in June 2023 (after it has been cleansed) which will provide themes across your school. This will include follow up support and a detailed analysis of your data.

2. Lancaster Model

The public health promotion model called the 'Lancaster Model' is being rolled for Year 9 pupils. This will replace the 'old version' of the health questionnaire and is more focused and targeted at identifying risks and providing targeted support.

The questionnaire will take about 20 minutes to complete. School nurses to discuss logistics directly with the school. This process will start after half term February.

A letter of consent has been developed for parental consent for schools to send to parents. Parents have 4 weeks to provide consent. Heather will track weekly and chase up any low uptake through schools.

Schools will receive a report by Easter by the school nurses to discuss themes in the findings for your school. The findings will be comparable to other schools (anonymised) and trends shared.

5. Vaping Questionnaire

Slough Public Health are conducting a research project, looking for 1000 responses of young people's views and habits on vaping. The project will end March 2023.

The responses will be anonymised, and the data will be fed back to the school at the end of the project which can be used to inform targeted interventions.

Each school with receive a £1000 incentive plus £5 for each child who responds. So overall approx. £2000 per school.

6. Community Safety and Serious Youth Violence (SYV)

Mark updated on the Safer Slough Partnership (SSP). Work is underway to weave the safeguarding priorities on child exploitation, DA, serious youth violence and other key safety messages with the SSP.

Mark attended the Knife Angel ceremony. The father of the recent homicide's was present amongst other members of the community affected by knife crime. His views include the importance in transitions between Year 6 and 7 and recognising, prevent and understanding trauma.
